Lockdown and Lent reflections

You may feel that lockdown has already forced you into a long period of reflection and self-examination! Lent - a season in which the church encourages reflection and self-examination - this year begins on 17th February (Ash Wednesday). Shrove Tuesday is the day before Ash Wednesday, and it is traditionally a day of preparation for Lent. The name 'shrove' is derived from the word 'shrive', meaning to hear someone's acknowledgement of their sins, to assure him or her of God's forgiveness. and to give appropriate spiritual advice. Shrove Tuesday has mainly lost its religious focus and in contemporary society the day is more commonly known as Pancake Day or Mardi Gras, a French term meaning 'Fat Tuesday' - the idea being that all the fats that have been kept for cooking are used up because they will not be used during Lent - and pancakes are a standard way of using up fat.

In contrast, many churches have retained the religious significance of Ash Wednesday, a day which reminds us of our

inherent humanness. During the service, as a sign of



a cross is made with ashes on the forehead of each participant, the following words are used: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return". This is a reminder that we are created out of the dust of the ground and we will return to dust. Yet the sign of the cross reminds us that through Jesus' death on the cross and resurrection we are offered forgiveness and eternal life in Christ, if we turn away from our sins and are faithful to Christ. I would recommend that you try to listen and participate in the Ash Wednesday circuit service, which this year is going to be led by Sue Stilwell, who works on the De Havilland project with Deacon Linda Kinchenton. It is a good way to start the season of Lent because it looks forward and reminds us of what comes at the end - Good Friday and Easter Sunday.
