## Family time on a Sunday

## 29th November 2020 - 1st Sunday in Advent

There are probably lots of things starting to happen in your house to get ready for Christmas. You might have an advent calendar you're looking forward to opening next week. Maybe you've made a cake or pudding or perhaps you're starting to think about getting decorations out. This year some streets in St Albans are getting ready window displays as part of <u>Festive Streets</u>. There has been a lot of discussion of fairy lights on our street Whatsapp group...

In Church we're thinking about how we prepare for Christmas too.

This week is the first Sunday of Advent and the first one of the new year in the Church.

In our reading, Jesus tells a story about servants waiting for their master, to teach us how we need to wait for his return.

### Bible reading (from Roots based on Mark 13: 24-37)

Keep watching,' said Jesus. 'Nobody knows when the Son of Man will come back to earth. Not even the angels, or the Son. The Father knows, though, and he will send clues.

'Keep watching. There will be days of suffering; after that the sun will be darkened; the moon will stop shining; stars will fall and the powers in heaven will be shaken. Then the Son of Man will come in the clouds. He'll gather his chosen people from everywhere on earth.

'Keep watching,' Jesus said. 'I'm telling you all this so you'll be ready. When you see new shoots growing on the trees, you know summer is coming. When you see the things I've described, you'll know that the Son of Man is coming. Heaven and earth will come to an end, but my words will last for ever.

'Keep watching. Be ready. Imagine a man going on a trip and leaving his servants in charge of his house. They don't know when he's coming back, but they know when he gets home he'll want something to eat and expect the house to be in order. The doorkeeper will have to stay awake because the man may return in the evening, or at midnight, or when the cock crows in the morning. If the

servants doze off, he'll come home and find them asleep. 'That's why I say keep watching,' Jesus repeated. 'Keep awake.

#### Questions to think about

- How do you think the disciples felt when they heard Jesus' warning?
- Have you ever had to stay awake when you were really tired? What did you do?
- What are some of the things we could do to keep our faith awake and ready for Jesus?

#### Ideas for activities

#### Glasses to keep watch

Here's a <u>template</u> for some cardboard glasses you could make and decorate in purple (the colour of Advent), to help us keep watch for signs of God coming.

#### Advent Wreath

An Advent wreath is one way you could remember to pray with your family over the next few Sundays. There's a sheet this week to colour in with an Advent wreath, showing the four candles that stand for Hope, Peace, Joy and Love.

Here are some things you could think about as you light your candles each week.

Week 1: Hope

What do you hope for?

Light the candle and ask God to bring His light and hope to people who are finding life hard.

Week 2: Love

Who do you love?

Say thank you to God for all the people you love and who love you.

Week 3: Joy

What brings you joy?

Ask God to help those who are sad to feel His joy.

Week 4: Peace

The wise men followed the star to search for Jesus. Pray all those who are searching for peace in a troubled world.

Christmas Day - Jesus Light of the World

Thank God for sending Jesus to be a light in the darkness and trouble of the world. Pray that God will help us to be like 'light' to others and that we will be able to help people find out who Jesus is.

This year although lots of us are excited about Christmas we also know some people are really struggling too and this can be sad time. The Church of England have created a different advent calendar on the themes of Comfort and Joy. 
#### Reverse Advent Calendar
